



New Healthcare Career Pathways Launch

Four new programs will prepare students for careers in fast-growing healthcare fields.



Physical Therapist Assistant

PTAs work in hospitals, private practices, outpatient, sports facilities, and more. The program can be completed in four semesters, with graduates eligible to take the national exam. www.canyons.edu/pta



Pharmacy Technology

Pharmacy technicians assist licensed pharmacists with preparing medications in pharmacies, hospitals, and long-term care facilities. This program can be completed in just two semesters, helping students to start work quickly. www.canyons.edu/pharmacy



Occupational Therapy Assistant

Occupational Therapy helps patients of all ages in the development, rehabilitation, enhancement, and preservation of essential life and work skills. The 16-month program includes fieldwork that prepares students for the national exam and to successfully work in the field. www.canyons.edu/ota



Diagnostic Medical Sonography

The two-year program will see students earn an associate degree, plus 1,100 hours of hands-on clinical experience that will prepare them for licensing exams and careers as ultrasound technicians. www.canyons.edu/dms



Advanced Technology Center Takes Shape

Planned as a two-story, 81,000-square-foot facility at the Valencia campus, the Advanced Technology Center will feature training in laser welding, robotics, mechatronics, metrology, welding, and computer-numerically-controlled (CNC) machining. Architectural plans are under review by the Division of the State Architect, setting the stage for construction to begin in 2026. The interim Advanced Technology Center continues to be a vital training resource for students, offering an eight-course Milling and Tooling Pathway certificate program that qualifies recipients for apprenticeships with local companies. atc.canyons.edu

First Bachelor's Program Debuts




AWARDS & DISTINCTIONS



Leader in Student ROI — COC ranks No. 14 statewide and No. 1 in northern Los Angeles County in a Return on Investment (ROI) analysis of 327 California community colleges and certificate-granting institutions.



2025 Pathway Champion — The Campaign for College Opportunity named COC a 2025 Pathway Champion for being one of three California community colleges that supported the highest percentage of Black students to complete a transfer-level math course within one year of their initial enrollment.
